Cond. Use 10/2002 CANCELLED

Moved by Sieg Neumann, Seconded by Ralph Groening: #177/02. Whereas Sunnydale Farms Ltd. have requested that their Conditional Use Application No. 10/2002 be withdrawn; Therefore Be it Resolved that the R. M. of Morris accept this withdrawal and does now consider that Conditional Use Application No. 10/2002 be now cancelled.

Cond. Use Hearing 18/2002 W.Sawatzky At 11:00 a.m., Council held a public hearing for Conditional Use Application No. 18/2002 submitted by Walter Sawatzky. Mr. Sawatzky was present for this hearing and he explained to Council that he currently has a conditional use for the operation of 600 feeder hogs and wishes to increase his operation to be 750 feeder hogs and 250 isowean pigs and that he planned to construct a new barn for this new operation. With the new barn, he is planning to construct pits under the barn for the storage of the manure. He would empty the pits in the spring and fall and that the manure would be disposed of by direct injection. There was discussion concerning the size of the manure storage pit and whether a larger pit was possible and only empty the pit once per year. Mr. Sawatzky indicated that it might be possible but that it would increase the cost of the barn.

The hearing was then ended.

Delegation

At 11:20 a.m., Council met with Staff Sgt. Len delPino of the Red River R.C.M.P. detachment. He had a written report for Council and he commented on the report and generally, there is a decline in the events called upon by the R.C.M.P.. The detachment is now at full strength and he feels that they are being proactive in dealing with issues. There were issues raised concerning the children traveling to and from school and their lack of road knowledge for both bicycling and walking.

Page 3 September 11, 2002

Public Works Foreman At 11:45 a.m., Council met with Mr. Don Harder, Public Works Foreman, and he indicated that there has been 27.5 miles of drainage work done which does not include the drift soil that was removed from the ditches earlier in the summer.

There has been no approval given yet for the municipality to undertake drainage work on the Shannon Drain pilot ditch.

There is a concern raised on the roads to new hog barns and that the construction of these barns are hurting the roads.

For our Prairie Grain Roads projects, they have been started and we are currently working on the Riverside Road.

The rural water lines have passed the required tests and all 34 residents have now had the water turned on and they have to arrange for their house to be connected to the water line in their basement. There were a number of leaks that the Municipality repaired and 2 meters also had to be replaced.

For the Sperling water and sewer project, the water reservoir is now being filled with water to be tested. The water plant building is now closed in and is ready for plumbing work to start.

Mr. Claude Robert has been hired as our mower operator to complete the season. The Dennis Dingwall will be starting at the Morris Arena on September 16, 2002.

There was discussion on the possibilities of hard surfacing the Riverside road from the current pavement to the park and would have a cost of approximately \$8,000.00 to provide a construction base and seal coating. Such a cost made the project unlikely, however, it was felt that we would apply for Provincial funding for this project and would reconsider the matter following the Provincial response to the request.
