RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

Minutes of a meeting of the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris held on Wednesday, January 19th, 2005 commencing at 9:00 a.m. Reeve Martens and Councillors Groening, Fraese, Kornelsen, Neumann, Robert and Wiens were present with Reeve Martens in the chair.

Reeve Martens reported on a meeting that had been held in Fargo. Steve Topping has verbally authorized 1 million-dollar funding over a 2-year period for drainage. This would be so that the R.M.'s could maintain provincial drainage. The Conservation Department would still like the R.M. to get into a Conservation District for long-term funding.

Council then reviewed their Committee Reports.

Councillor Robert reported that there are still problems with water quality up at his place. There seems to be no chlorine left by the time the water gets there.

Resolved that the R.M. of Morris adopt the recommendations of the Employee Eyeluations. Committee meeting dated December 17th, 2004.

RELATIONS

Reeve Martens advised that he is now the Secretary Treasurer and is on the Executive of the Red River Basin Commission. This means that he will move up to Vice President in two years and President in four years. He also reported on the Triple R Planning Session, which will be held later on today.

Councillor Groening reported that the drain maintenance has not been finalized yet for 2005.

Reeve Martens reported that the Red River Coalition will probably disband tomorrow.

Councillor Fraese reported on the Sperling CCD. The Sperling Bonspiel will be held February 11th-13th. Councillor Fraese also reported on the Red River Health Foundation. They have hired a new bookkeeper. There is no more hospital in Emerson, but only a Palliative Care Centre.

Councillor Kornelsen reported that the Rosenort Fire Department is experiencing some problems due to a shortage of numbers.

The C.A.O. was instructed to contact the Pembina Valley Tourism, and advise them that Councillor Wiens is now the representative.

Councillor Kornelsen reported that the joint fire meeting to discuss capital planning will probably be held on March 3rd or March 8th. The intention would be to start the meeting at 5:30 p.m. with council members only and then to have the fire department members come in 7:00 p.m.

The C.A.O. was asked to contact Sheryl Feller and see if Fire Department could be included in the agenda for the Planning Session in January.

Councillor Kornelsen reported that the Fire Department Appreciation Supper will be held on January 25th at 6:00 p.m. in Lowe Farm.

Don Harder attended the meeting at 11:15 a.m. He showed Council a map showing the chlorine testing and the results. Mr. Harder also discussed rural mailboxes with Council.

Council set a policy that they will not pay for any damages done to mailboxes by snow-clearing equipment, on the understanding that the primary purpose for roads is to accommodate traffic, which involves snow clearing. Any private structures installed on a road allowance would be done at the owners' risk. Council also asked the C.A.O. to write to Canada Post and request that rural delivery be eliminated. Council believes that people go to town on a regular basis anyway and could pick up their mail there.

Don Harder continued his report and advised that at the house fire in Lowe Farm they had put heat-tape on the water lines and sewer lines to keep them from freezing. Mr. Harder had requested permission from a neighbor to plug in these heat tapes. This neighbor will be sending a bill to the insurance company. Mr. Harder also reported on the chlorine samples and advised that all of them should be approximately 0.5 Free. The samples that he has obtained are between 0.00 and 0.07. Mr. Harder also advised that the trencher that the R.M. was interested in purchasing has been sold. He has another one that is available which has less power and more hours, and is one year older for a net price of \$209,000.00. Mr. Harder also advised that he could obtain a building that would be 60 feet wide, by 140 feet long, by 20 feet high at a cost of \$64,800.00 US. This building could be lined and insulated at a cost of \$20,000.00.

The C.A.O. was asked to check on the taxes for the R.M. shop and also to check into several water billings.

Council then reviewed the financial statements for November 30th. Council asked the C.A.O. to change the financial statements so that the profit and loss would show two years figures. The C.A.O. was also asked to check into the Environmental Health sales of service and the sale of transport services, as well as road construction costs for the next meeting.
